WHEREAS: The poem has been and continues to be used as a powerful tool to bridge differences, and will be recited

at the 50th year celebration of Reverend Martin Luther King's Mountaintop speech; and

RESOLVED: That the Boston City Council hereby recognizes Sara Ting, World Unity Inc., and the "Sun Poem" for

their dedication to a better Boston, and that this Resolution be duly signed by the President of the City
